Virtue of the Month: Thankfulness

Each month, the students and staff at King Traditional school explore and learn about a different virtue. These virtues are then celebrated at the end of the month at our student of the month assemblies. By taking the time to explore these different aspects of social responsibility, we hope to build a learning community where students know how to respectfully navigate their peers. This month, the virtue is Thankfulness. Although the students will be learning about what it means to be thankful at school, we encourage you (as our educational partners) to also discuss this virtue at home as well. What does thankfulness mean to you? What are you thankful for at home? Why is being thankful important?

Dressing for the Weather

Now that October has arrived, it seems the rainy weather has finally found us. With the return of the rain, it is important to ensure that students come to school dressed for the weather. The majority of days at school, students will be going outside at recess and after the lunch eating period so they need to be dressed appropriately for the weather. Please remind your child to wear a jacket to school as fall weather arrives. If it looks like rain is in the forecast, students should ensure that coats have either a hood, or that they bring an umbrella as well as appropriate foot gear. Our field and track can sometimes get muddy or develop rain puddles, so any steps you can take at home to ensure your children keep dry would be appreciated.

Safety Drills at King Traditional:

Each year, schools across the district practice emergency drills so that if there ever is a real emergency, everyone will know just what to do! We practice fire drills, shelter in place drills, even earthquake and lockdown drills. Here is a list of all the emergency drills for the year in case you would like to keep them in mind. We will remind you of these drills in future memos as well.

Reminder: King Traditional is a Nut-Free School

As we approach Halloween week, we sometimes see an increase of treats at school. It is important to remind families that we are a nut-free school. All Halloween treats that contain (or may contain) nuts are not to be brought on campus in order to keep our students with allergies safe. This should also be kept in mind as some families bring in birthday treats. To keep everyone safe, please only bring in treats that can be guaranteed to contain no nuts.

<u>Terry Fox Fundraiser</u>: Is now complete! Thank you to everyone who donated to support cancer research during our Terry Fox fundraiser. As a learning community, we managed to raise <u>over \$1300</u>. All these funds will go directly to supporting the search for a cure and donated to the Terry Fox Foundation. If you are curious, for each dollar brought in by students, they were given 1 vote for a staff member to get splattered with paint. The staff member with the most votes (and the one getting splattered) is Mrs. Carroll! The painting event will take place this Friday after a Terry Fox school-wide PE activity outside. 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Abbotsford Traditional School Intermediate Visit: Each year, in an effort to build continuity between our traditional campuses and help prepare the intermediate students for what middle school looks like, the grade 4 and 5 classes from each of the Traditional Elementary schools in the district visit the Traditional middle-high school. These visits are intentionally planned so that students can gain a fair sense of what middle/high school looks like and so that some of the nervousness of transitioning into middle schools is removed through familiarity. This year, our grade 4 and 5 classes will be visiting ATS on October 25th. The students will be taking the bus from campus, and taken for a short tour, see how middle school works, Q and A, and other fun activities including receiving an ATS T-shirt and snacks! Early Dismissal for Parent Teacher Interviews. On October 18th and 19th, schools across the Abbotsford District will be dismissing 2.5 hours early to accommodate Parent Teacher Interviews. For King Traditional Elementary, this means that school will be dismissed at 11:54 both days (prior to lunchtime). Buses will be arriving at this time to pick up students. Recently, you should have received an email regarding instructions on how to book a time spot with your child's teacher for a parent/teacher conference. Please follow the link included to find our online booking program and choose your spot. There will be both afternoon and evening spots available, but will fill up fast. If you need assistance, please contact the office. If you would like to meet or have a phone call outside of the bookable time spots available, please contact your child's teacher to see what can be arranged. It is our hope that 100% of our students' families will be able to book a time and connect with our teachers about the educational journey of their children. Interviews are in person this year, but can also take the form of a phone call or video conference if specifically requested.

Communication at King: At King Traditional school we view our parents as educational partners. We appreciate connection and communication between families and our learning community because the better understanding we collectively have of our students, the better position we find ourselves in to support meaningful educational opportunities. This kind of educational relationship requires communication. The educational staff here at King would like to remind you that they are happy to connect with you via email, phone calls, digital platforms such as Seesaw, or book times to speak with you on campus. They would also like to remind you that the district policy for communication is to consult with teachers first, and if you have further questions or need additional support, to contact the principal second. Teachers are the most informed about what is happening in the classroom, and are in the best position to offer insight into instruction and/or social/emotional areas.
