What to do if your child becomes sick:

From time to time we all get sick. It happens! At King Traditional, we have health protocols in place to ensure that we can keep our students as safe and healthy as possible. This means, its important to know what to do if you child becomes sick on a school day.

Your child's health and safety are our top priority. If your child becomes ill at school during the school day, here's what happens:

- We'll contact you right away to let you know.
- Your child will be placed in a supervised space (like the medical room) while they rest. This is to prevent the possible spread of germs to others.
- If your child doesn't improve, we'll reach out and arrange a pick up. Sick children cannot stay at school because we want to keep all their classmates healthy.
- We will keep an eye on your little one! We ensure they're safely supervised until you or an emergency contact arrives to take them home.
- No medication is given at school unless there's a pre-arranged medical plan.

Please note, that to help prevent the spread of illness related germs and keep our students healthy, students who throw-up must stay home for **24 hours** and **until symptoms have resolved**.

Other ways to help us keep your children safe: To help us respond quickly and safely: please keep your emergency contact info up to date, inform us of any medical conditions (e.g., allergies, asthma, diabetes) and if special medical arrangements need to be made for chronic health, please make sure your child's Medical Planning Form is current.





As always, if you need to book an absence, please feel free to use the **safe arrival tool** to communicate with us or simply call our office and we can take it from there! Thank you for your understanding in advance for your understanding. As we enter flu season, following these steps is as important as ever to the prevention of spreading sickness in our school.

Terry Fox Fundraising:

This week marks the start of our cancer research fundraising. To make this initiative more fun, we are running an exciting fundraiser with our staff and students. Here is how it works:

- for ever dollar students donate, they will get 1 vote for a teacher.
- the teacher with the most votes will be splattered in paint while the whole school cheers them on!
- the class that raises the most donations will be the class that gets to splatter the teacher in paint (while the rest of the school watches and cheers them on!)

We can't wait to see who it will be this time! Donations can be made by bringing cash into the school or by donating online through the schoolcashonline website. Please note that an option to donate will appear on schoolcashonline but this is not mandatory! It is voluntary to donate. You do not need to make an online payment unless you would like to support cancer research. All funds this year are split between the Terry Fox Cancer Research Foundation, and Cops for Cancer Tour.

Drop off and Pick Up Expectations:

This document has instructions regarding ways to ensure our students are kept safe during drop off/pick up time. Student safety is very important to us at King Traditional Elementary School so please carefully read this document! If we follow the rules together, we can help ensure that everyone stays safe. Please read this procedure document. That said, the biggest thing to remember is to drive slowly and carefully, always use sidewalks and crosswalks, and **never enter the bus lane** by either vehicle or walking. Lastly, the long drop off lane in the front of our campus is for temporary drop off and pick up stopping. Please do not park there and exit your vehicle. You are welcome to park in our parent parking lot located at the end of the drop off lane if you wish to leave the vehicle. This prevents a back up, and cars not being able to turn onto our property from the busy road.

Parent Advisory Council (PAC): The Parent Advisory Council or PAC is a very important parent group that helps ensure our children's experiences here at King are extra special. If you have a child at our school, you are a member of our PAC automatically! The PAC meet once a month or so, and parents JUST LIKE YOU talk about such things as arranging fundraising and planning extra special opportunities for students and parents. These could range from things such as organizing movie nights for families and literacy picnics to supporting activities like Garden Club, Bhangra Club, rock climbing, roller blading and much more! We wouldn't be able to provide all of these amazing opportunities (and more) without parents like you being willing to participate in our PAC. Any parent can attend our PAC meetings and contribute. That said, there are some special positions that are assigned to parents for a period of time (such as PAC president, secretary, treasurer, fundraising chair, hot lunch organizer and more!). There are many jobs that you can sign up for, or you can simply attend and be a part of the conversation.
